

Rehabilitation Psychology: From Science to Practice

The purpose of this presentation is to overview the specialty of rehabilitation psychology, its roles and functions in the medical and vocational rehabilitation process, and its relationship with clinical neuropsychology and health psychology; discuss theoretical frameworks underlying the professional practice of rehabilitation psychology; and review theory-driven research and evidence-based practice in rehabilitation psychology.

Professor Chan is a licensed psychologist and a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor. He is also a National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research Distinguished Research Fellow and a Fellow in the American Psychological Association (APA). Currently, he chairs the APA Committee on Disability Issues in Psychology and is a member of the APA Division 22 (Rehabilitation Psychology) Fellows Committee. Professor Chan has published extensively, more than 250 refereed journal articles and book chapters. Repeatedly recognized for his achievements, awards bestowed upon Professor Chan include eight Research Awards (American Rehabilitation Counseling Association), Research Award (American Counseling Association), James R. Garrett New Career Research Achievement Award (American Psychological Association, Division of Rehabilitation Psychology), James R. Garrett Distinguished Career in Rehabilitation Research Award (American Rehabilitation Counseling Association), and Educator of the Year Award (National Council on Rehabilitation Education).
