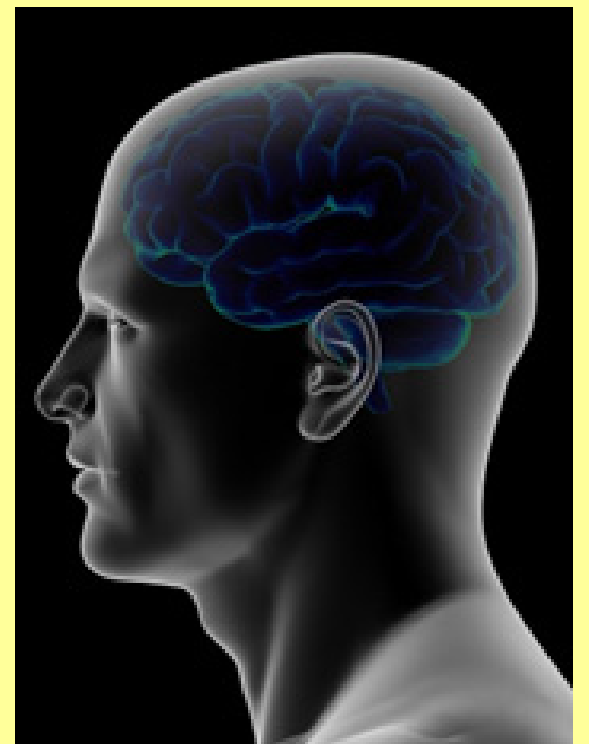


## Beyond the Physical: Cognitive Syndromes and Rehabilitation after Stroke

Cognitive disorders after stroke are common and have impact on recovery and outcome after stroke. Thus, early assessment and management are critical to maximizing outcomes.

This talk will present a framework for management of cognitive disorders, including discussion of the major cognitive syndromes after stroke, their impact on recovery, and an approach to assessment, management and rehabilitation.

She has been practicing as a neuropsychologist since 1993 at the Queen Elizabeth II Health Sciences Centre, working with individuals with neurological disorders, particularly stroke. Her research is concerned with the investigation and rehabilitation of neurocognitive deficits due to neurological disease.
